Parish Council News

The Parish Council has been busy maintaining various areas of the village during this year, most notably maintaining the equipment in the play area. The perimeter fencing was altered to make the play area safer, and to stop children escaping onto the road! Many positive comments have been received about the new fence. We have also replaced the bridges on the Toddler multiplay unit so that the gaps between the vertical bars are narrower, thus making them safer for the children. Various other pieces of wooden equipment parts have also been replaced due to wear and tear.

We are also considering installing a gate in the far corner of the playground (near the swings where there is currently an opening to the pavement). The options are to leave the opening as it is, fence off the gap, or install a gate to the pavement. Are you a user of the play area? If so, please let us know what your preferred option would be? (Contact details below).

This year the Parish Council put up hanging baskets along Sheffield Road, on lamp columns and also on the railings at the front of The Willows housing estate. We were very pleased with the response to the baskets and will be putting them up in future years also. We would like to increase the number of baskets next summer by extending further along Sheffield Road in both directions. Purchasing and maintaining the baskets throughout the summer incurs cost, but is definitely worth it! The village looked beautiful. If you would be interested in donating towards the cost of next years baskets please do get in touch with the Clerk.

The Parish Council have several other initiatives that they are considering for the future, including a community allotment, community orchard and adult open-air fitness equipment.

***The Titivator volunteer group** have been very busy over the summer, litter picking, pruning, weeding, removing graffiti, planting, strimming and so on. The list of jobs completed is vast. The next job they will be doing is putting on the Christmas tree. Anyone wishing to join the group would be made most welcome. The Parish Council receive many reports of issues that bother residents over the course of a year. There are some recurring issues which the Council would ask politely that people refrain from doing. These are:

Dog Fouling – please clear up after your dog and use the dog bins available around the village, alternatively take the bag home to your own bin. Leaving bags hanging in trees is unacceptable. Barnsley Council have stated that if you spot dog fouling on a pavement near you, please report it to them on 775656. The Neighbourhood Pride Team will come out and clear it, and if they find that a particular area is being fouled regularly then there is a greater chance of getting the Dog Warden to come out to patrol the area and catch the offenders.

Fly tipping – Please do not dump rubbish at the sides of roads/footpaths. There has been a lot of fly tipping in Oxspring in the last year and it makes the village unsightly.

Neighbourhood Plan Update

It may seem to some that Oxspring's Neighbourhood Development Plan (NDP) has been talked about forever without any obvious signs that the end is in sight. At last, however, a significant milestone has been reached. The Parish Council and Steering Group have taken the Plan as far as we can for now. The final stages will be undertaken by Barnsley Metropolitan Borough Council (BMBC), from the Regulation 16 Public Consultation to Examination, Referendum and Adoption.

As a reminder for those who may have forgotten, or do not know, BMBC started to prepare a Local Plan sometime after we had already begun preliminary preparations on Oxspring's Neighbourhood Development Plan. In order for our Plan to comply with the Government's Regulations on Neighbourhood Plans it makes sense for the BMBC Local Plan to have been through its Examination process before Oxspring's NDP is submitted for Examination. Briefly, the reason for this is so that any issues or potential changes which could impact on Oxspring's NDP have been highlighted and dealt with. If we were to proceed with our NDP at an earlier stage a review of Oxspring's NDP may then be required which could incur unwanted further delays and unnecessary additional expenditure.

BMBC propose submitting their Local Plan to the next stage this autumn with a view to it having been Examined and Adopted by the summer of next year (2017). As soon as the Examiner's report is available on the BMBC Local Plan Oxspring Parish Council will submit the Neighbourhood Development Plan to BMBC. They will then proceed to the Regulation 16 Public Consultation and Examination; if all goes smoothly, a referendum should be held in the village in the autumn of next year (2017) with the NDP being adopted by the end of the year.

We can appreciate that by next year people may have forgotten all about the Oxspring NDP and with that in mind a campaign will be launched in the late spring to rekindle interest and keep everyone up to date with developments. Any relevant information will also be put on the NDP and Parish Council Websites. This has been a long and often frustrating process but, though it may still seem some way off, the end is in sight.
