SPEED INDICATOR DEVICES (SID'S)

The Parish Council have been monitoring the two speed indicator devices we have in the village to see if they improve speeding at any level. You may remember that we purchased three solar panels and mounting posts but only two SIDs. At the last Parish Council meeting on Monday 3rd October, we discussed the results from the latest monitoring report and agreed that we would continue monitoring until the end of November and then make a decision regarding whether to relocate the SID from Upper Roughbirchworth to Sheffield Road outside the Waggon and Horses, or whether to consider investing in a third SID so that we have most of the main entrances and exits into the village covered. We will report in due course.

PENISTONE AREA VOLUNTEER CELEBRATION EVENT

On the 27th September the Penistone Area Team hosted a Celebration event to say thank you to the many volunteers in our area who give freely of their time to help to keep our villages looking tidy, clean and in good order. The event was hosted at Wortley Hall and individual parishes were asked to nominate anyone who they believed had worked tirelessly to support their village through voluntary work. Each parish was limited to the number of people they could nominate and, in our parish, the three nominations were as follows:

They were each awarded with a certificate, which was presented to them individually, and they were treated to a buffet supper and an evening of delightful entertainment provided by Angel Voices, and what a good night they had!

A huge thank you to the BMBC Penistone Area Team for all their hard work in making the evening such a resounding success.

CHILDRENS PLAYGROUND

The Parish Council have successfully applied for a grant from the BMBC s106 fund to undertake some repairs, replacements and improvements to the children's play area. The s106 panel agreed to our application for £17,169 and granted us £15,169 towards the overall cost. The Penistone Ward Alliance team were more than happy to contribute £2000 towards the total cost ensuring that we could complete the list of works that the Parish Council want to undertake. The Parish Council will also be making a contribution of £2000 towards some additional repairs and replacements that have cropped up since the application was made.

A huge thank you to both the BMBC s106 Team and the Ward Alliance Committee for their continued support.

Hopefully, this work will be carried out within the next couple of months and we will have to close the children's play area for perhaps two/three days. We will try to give as much advance notice as possible, but it will be worth it in the end.

BOWLING CLUB

THE TITIVATORS


